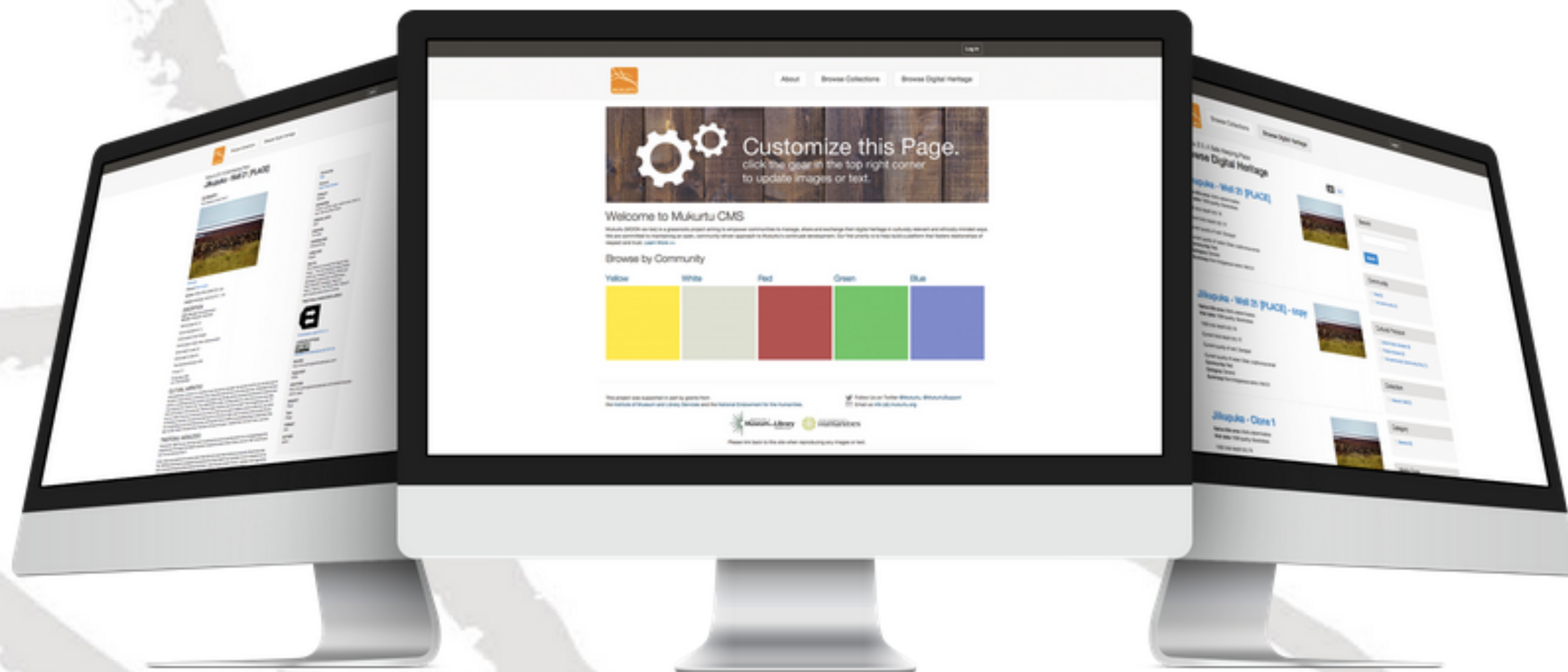

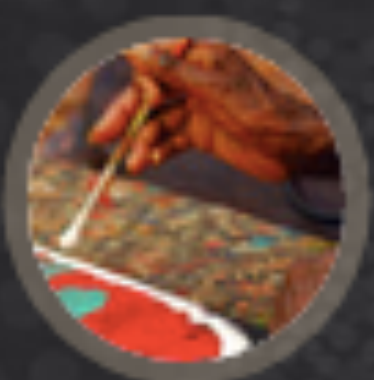

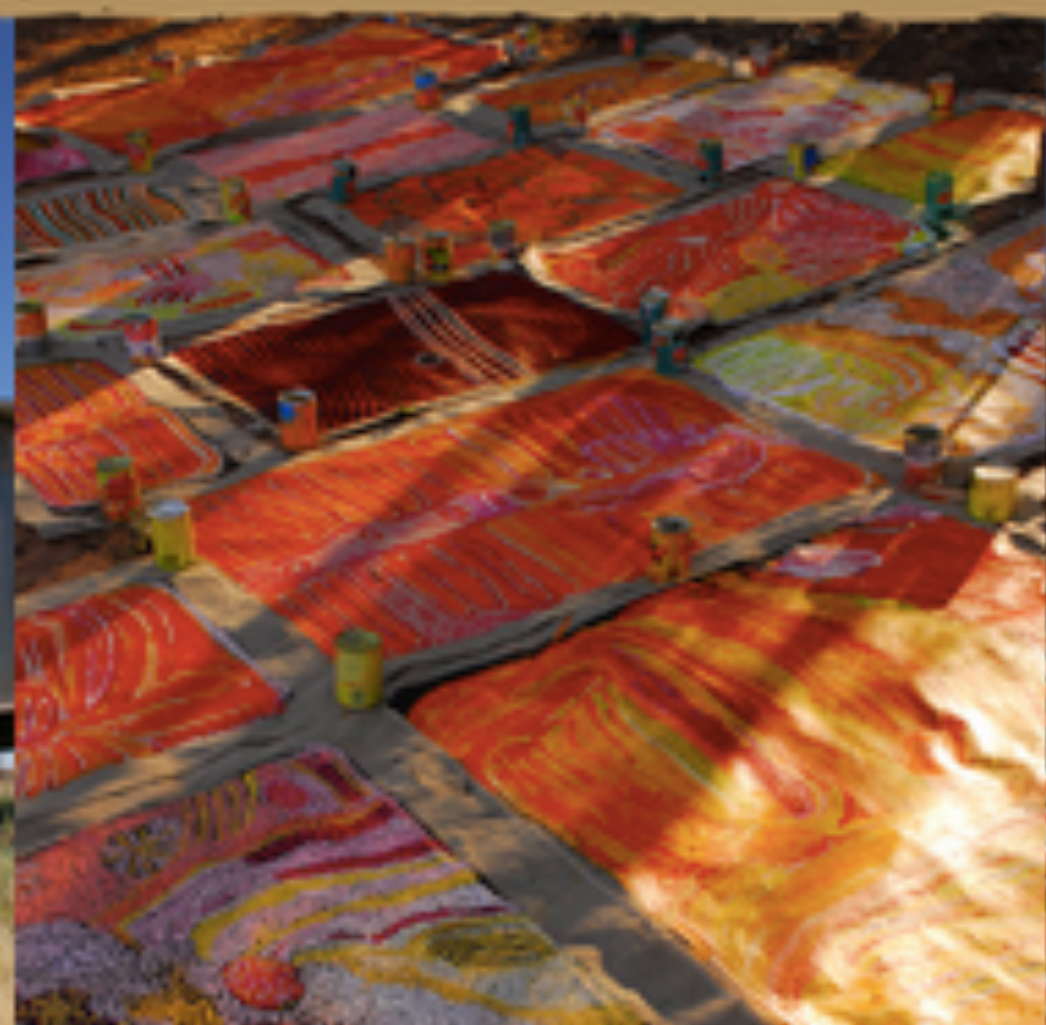

The Kodiak Alutiiq language is severely threatened. Today there are just 33 fluent Native Alutiiq speakers remaining in the Kodiak region, with approximately 10 speakers actively working on language revitalization.

The Naken-Natmen project is an effort to engage language learners, speakers, and linguistic researchers in language revitalization by making language archives accessible.

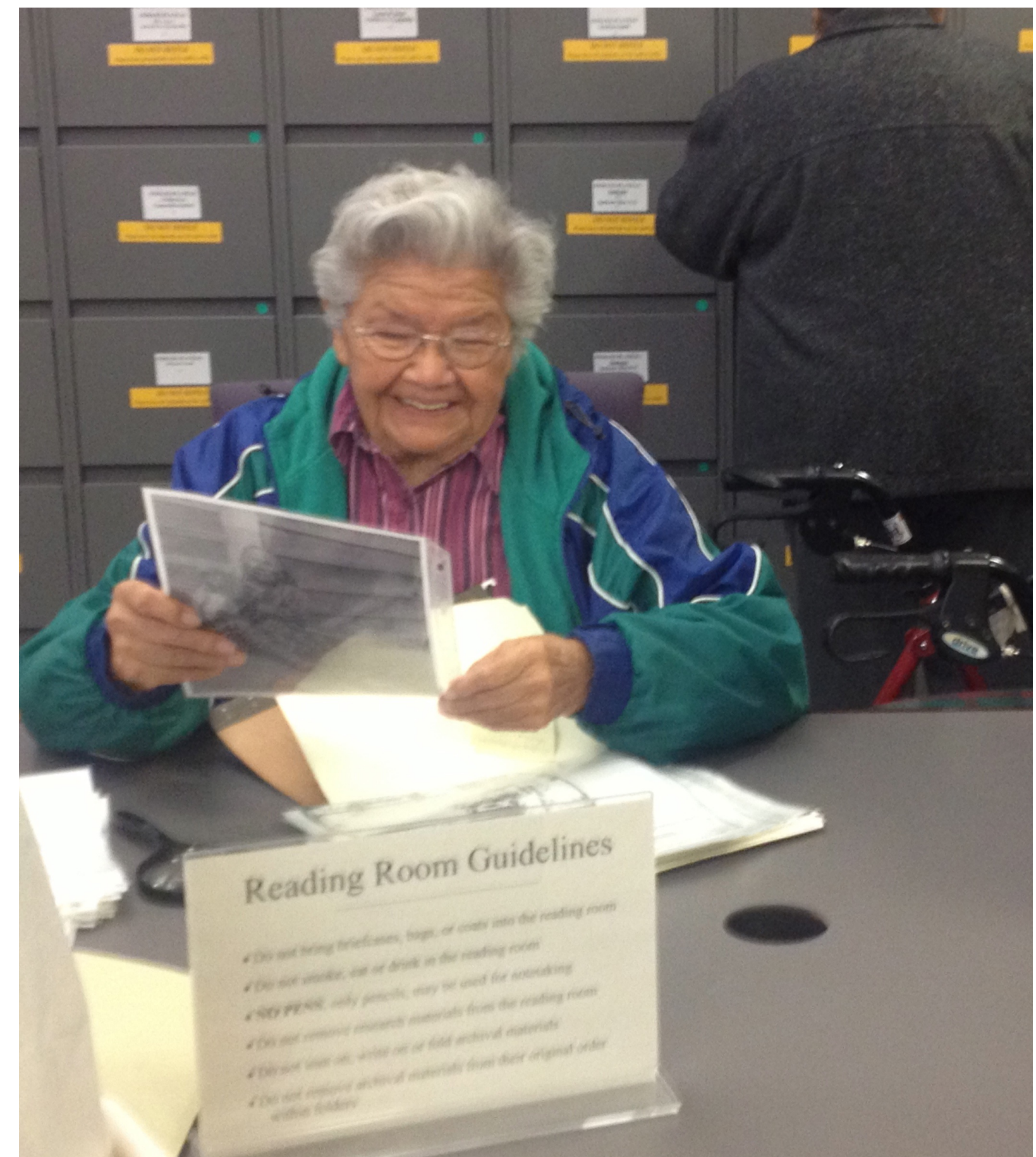
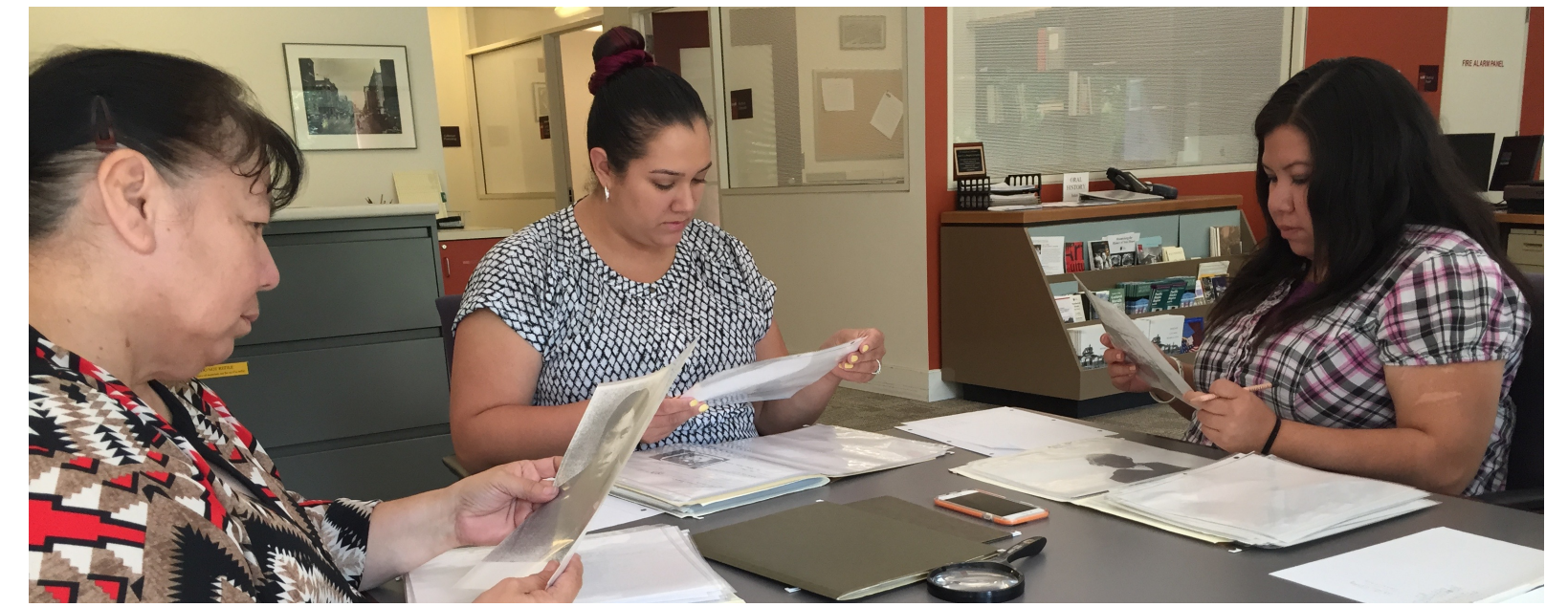

CULTURAL NARRATIVE:

These three ladies are in a traditional plateau camp during a celebration. The ladies are all wearing buckskin dresses more reserved for dancing and ceremonies. Their dresses are somewhat longer in length so this tells me that they are not Cayuse, Umatilla or Walla Walla. Two of the ladies are not married in this picture, one with the beaded headband the other with the headband and one eagle feather. The lady on the end wearing two feathers in her headband would draw the conclusion she is married in my beliefs and customs. I have a strong feeling that the first lady is Virginia Beavert/Yakama. Ceremony

Young woman would wear these during the feast time with their hats (patlupah) and serve their traditional foods of roots and berries. If they were participating in a funeral it would be a sign of respect for the individual that had passed. Jolena Tillequots, Yakama

 - Drawing: multiple levels
 - Cassette tape: For review (multiple protocols layered for multiple stages), limited access, Eastern Cree language review
 - Video Tape: Can it be viewed? Educational? Verified
 - How to access - elders, language speakers to review, gender
- Categories:
 - Drawing: Art, Treaty negotiations, Birchbark, Clans, Wildlife, Landscape
 - Video tape: land, landscapes, education, sacred sites/place, lifeways, medicine/healing
 - Fishing traditions, location, geography, landscape, methods, subsistence practices
- Decision-Making (who decides?)
 - Gather information, who would be the audience?
 - Getting in contact with the tribe
 - Include media? Or just description?
 - Elders, ceremonial people, language - how to layer in information
 - Consult with tribal council, admin, traditional elders - seek permission and add information
- When to use TK Labels: when something is already in the public domain (but community values should be added), outreach/education, "Verified" lets people know what verified means
 - Add TK label to LC record - seasonal (tag as seasonal, or use along with protocol)
- When to add Community Records (multiple records): Public access/community access
