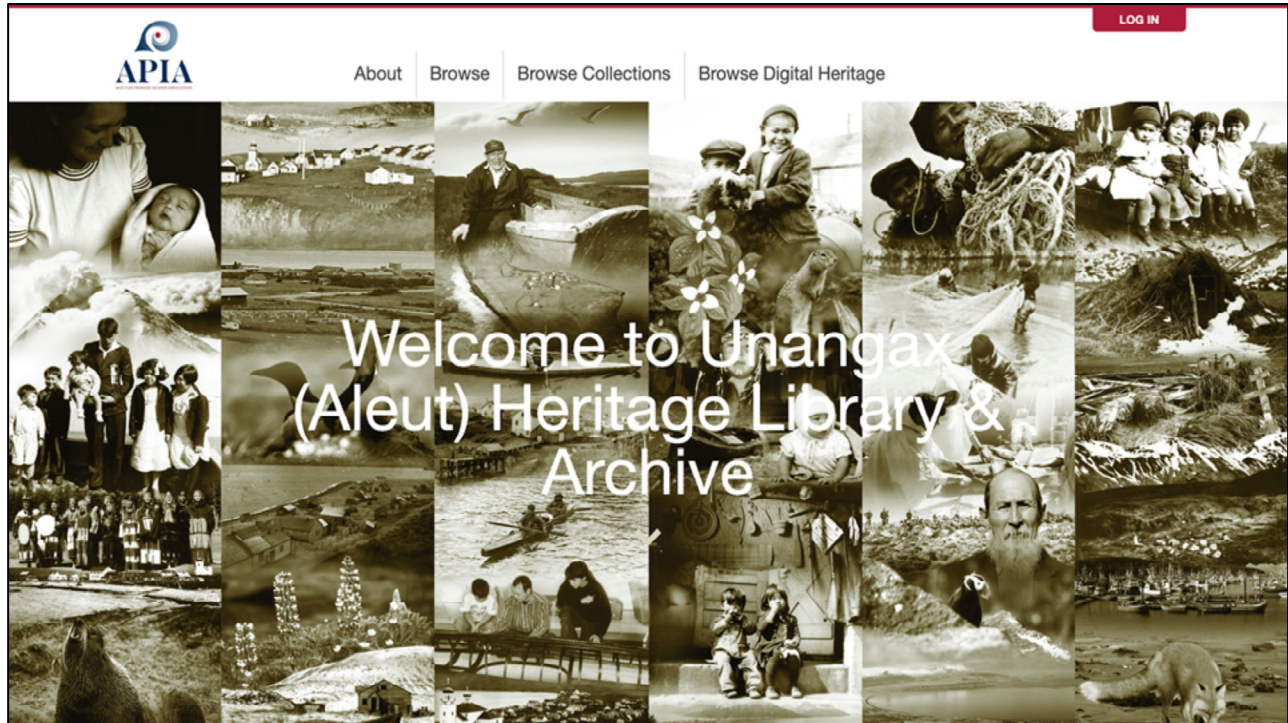

- Choosing between two **colour schemes** -

- Changing your site logo - replacing the Mukurtu icon with something more personal.
- Changing the navigation menu - adding or removing links and renaming links to best guide your users.
- Of course customizing the hero image on the front page. One option is the full-bleed or full page hero image used here...

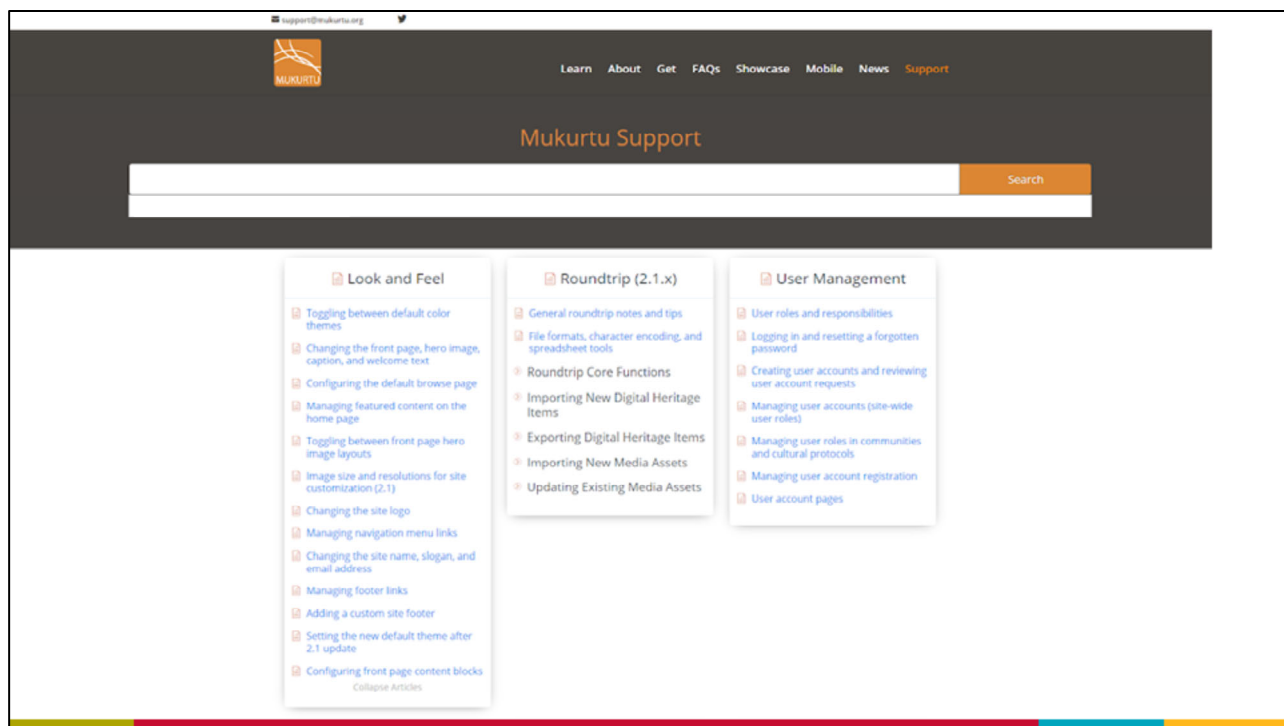

- You can choose to display featured content on the front page of your site to really guide users to specific items or collections. We know some folks will rotate and change these seasonally, for example.

Panel	Section	Description
SET UP SITE	Change site name, slogan and email address.	Shortcut to page where you can change some settings for this site. The site name, a slogan for your site, and the email address for the site administrator.
	Change Logo	Shortcut to theme settings where you can change your logo.
	View & Edit About page	Mukurtu comes with a default about page that you can edit.
	Enable and disable extra menu items	Mukurtu comes with additional pages that you can enable.
	Layout and Design	Change settings for the currently active theme.
	Change Theme Settings	Change settings for the currently active theme.

BATCH IMPORT CONTENT	Import Digital Heritage Items	Batch import many digital heritage items from CSV file. If the media assets have associated metadata, import the media files first using the media importers.
	Import Dictionary Words	Batch import many dictionary words.
	Import Dictionary Word Entries	Batch import additional dictionary word entries.
	All Importers	View a list of all available importers.
	Export Digital Heritage Items	Select digital heritage items for exporting to a CSV or XML file.
COMMUNITIES AND PROTOCOLS	Export Dictionary Words	Select dictionary words for exporting to a CSV file.
	Import from Zip Archive	Batch import content from a Zip Archive.
